

**TIME TO ADDRESS

As our parade season comes to a close, Nobles and Units need to address our membership. The Membership Committee needs your help and support. Our goal for 2015 was to create 70 new Nobles, and as of today we have created only 32. We want to commend those Units who have addressed their suspension list. We thank you for your efforts.

We as Shriners are asking the general public for their support on our PSA's (Public Service Announcements on TV). We are asking for \$19 a month to support our hospitals or 63 cents a day for our "Love to the Rescue" campaign. This campaign is getting great results. At \$19 a month, that is \$228 a year for our hospitals. Can we, as Nobles of KEM Shrine, pay our \$50 dues a year? All Nobles need to give this serious thought.

**2016 DUES INCREASE**

At present there are three components to the Shrine Dues that we all pay.

These are :

Hospital Assessment	\$ 5.00
Imperial Per Capita Charge	\$ 15.00
Kem Dues	\$ 30.00
<b>Total dues prior years</b>	<b>\$ 50.00</b>

The new dues will be as follows

Hospital Assessment	\$ 5.00
Imperial Per Capita Charge	\$ 30.00
Kem Dues	\$ 30.00
<b>Total dues 2016</b>	<b>\$ 65.00</b>

The last change in the Imperial Per Capita Charge was in 2003. The Imperial Per Capita Charge had to increase because of the decreasing numbers of Shrine membership and the increasing cost of doing business. The Imperial leadership has put significant effort into controlling and reducing their operating costs. It was apparent that there was no choice but to increase their income. At the last Imperial session and the Representatives approved the increase.

Kem dues were last increased in 1999. At present Kem has been able to avoid increases in our Dues because we have maintained our Membership (16 years of Growth) and because the increases in the income from the Grand Forks Circus have kept pace with inflation and other cost increases.


