

Dear Fellow Nobles.

We know that, like us, you have been concerned for our Shriners Hospitals for Children locations in the path of hurricanes and wildfires. We're relieved to let you know that our patients and staff members in these areas are safe.

Our hospitals in Galveston, Houston and Shreveport took all necessary precautions as Hurricane Laura approached. The city of Galveston was under a mandatory evacuation order, but our hospital remained open for referrals and emergencies. As the hurricane passed on Thursday, the Texas hospitals experienced no issues and resumed business as usual the next day.

Our Shreveport hospital experienced a temporary loss of power, and there is some cleanup work for the yard crew, but the hospital weathered the hurricane with no substantial problems for patients, staff or property.

In Northern California, our hospital is not threatened by the wildfires. Some workforce members were forced to evacuate their homes, but all have returned and no property was damaged. The fires are now under control, and air quality continues to improve each day. Our medical staff is caring for several children who sustained burns due to the wildfires.

We are so proud of our Shriners Hospitals for Children staff members who have continued to provide the most amazing care anywhere despite these difficult and frightening circumstances. Their devotion to our patients and families is an inspiration to us, and we are sure, to you too.



A Message from the Chairman of the Board of Trustees



Dear Fellow Nobles,

The world has become a much smaller place. Shriners Hospitals for Children® has a global reputation for compassion and excellence, and continues to expand its efforts to reach as many children who may need the services of our unique health care system, regardless of where they live.

We have implemented an international strategic plan that will help us serve the children of the world more effectively and efficiently, and closer to their homes. Under the direction of Marjorie McEttrick-Maloney, RN, BSN, MPA/H, our chief nursing officer, and with guidance from a consultant, this plan streamlines our international services, and includes initiatives for many parts of the world, including Brazil, the Philippines, Canada and Mexico. Today, I would like to share some exciting developments in our strategy for the children of Mexico.

Shriners Hospitals has had a presence in Tijuana, Mexico, for many years. From 1998 to 2012, we held outreach clinics at Hospital Infantil de las California (HIC). In 2012, we opened an ambulatory clinic adjacent to HIC. We recently moved our clinic to within Hospital Angeles in Tijuana in order to provide additional services, including inpatient and more complex surgical treatments. Today, that clinic, which is under the direction of our Pasadena, California, location, serves more than 10,000 children annually, providing orthopaedic surgical care and outpatient clinic visits, including orthotics and prosthetics services.

Based on our desire to increase our presence in

Dear Brothers,

We hope this letter finds you and your family safe and healthy during this pandemic. This is a difficult time for everyone, some more than others. Try to stay in contact with your Brothers and let them know you are thinking of them.

The 105-year-old Grand Forks Masonic Center building is also going through a difficult time. The building is mostly empty. Events have been cancelled or postponed due to COVID. Some of these events generate income to help pay for expenses and maintenance of this magnificent building. The Masonic Building Corporation and the Grand Forks Masonic Preservation Association have been meeting on a regular basis (via Zoom internet meetings) to keep the building maintained and to plan for the future of this historic building.

Some of the items discussed at the meetings are paying off the debt for the boiler, repairing a roof leak on the elevator shaft. Possible upgrades to the building, such as restrooms and upgrading the electrical system to make the building more useable for Masons, Shriners and the public when renting our building for events. Repairing a large crack on the east wall of the building in 2018 was our last big expense, after replacing the boiler.

The Grand Forks Masonic Center Preservation Association is an IRS 501c3 Corporation. Donations to the GFMCPA can be used as a tax-deductible donation. Please consider this when you are making charitable gifts in 2020. We can also accept gifts from estates or in memoriam to honor a person or group.

Thank you for your past support! Please consider making a gift this year to help maintain the largest active surviving Masonic Lodge in ND. We will overcome this pandemic and we will be enjoying the fellowship of fellow Masons at meetings and dinners in our building once again.

Mexico, and the success of our clinic in Tijuana, we are pursuing discussions with Hospital Angeles officials to establish similar clinics at their locations in Guadalajara, Monterrey and Juarez, Mexico. If these clinics also are successful and meet our goals of reaching and caring for the children who need our expertise, we will have additional conversations with a goal of further expanding these efforts. Hospital Angeles has approximately 30 locations throughout Mexico, which could provide an opportunity for Shriners Hospitals to establish a network of affiliated clinics.

Obviously, there will be many details to work out, from staffing to space allotments, but the

possibilities are tremendous – and fit well with the mission and goals of Shriners Hospitals for Children, especially as we seek to increase our affiliations and access points in order to reach and treat more children effectively, efficiently and closer to their homes.

An important part of our international strategic plan is including educational programs for local medical professionals in our outreach efforts. Ultimately, this will allow more children to receive care in their home countries, rather than needing to travel to the U.S. for care. Of course, we will always refer children to our facilities if that is the best course of action for them.

These are especially challenging times, as we work within the restrictions caused by the pandemic, but they are also exciting times with great promise for the future of our unique, compassionate health care system.

I look forward to sharing information about our strategic plans for other international locations in the future.
