In 1870, a group of Masons met regularly for lunch at the Knickerbocker Cottage in New York City, and discussed the idea of forming a new fraternity for Masons, based on the fundamentals of Masonry, but with the added elements of fun and fellowship. From these discussions, Dr. Walter Fleming, a prominent physician, and Billy Florence, a famous actor, founded the Ancient Arabic Order of the **Nobles of the Mystic Shrine** (A.A.O.N.M.S.), now Shriners International, in 1872.








Since our founding 150 years ago, our fraternity has been dedicated to brotherhood, compassion, service to other and building relationships through sharing fun and fellowship.

Imperial Session was held. In recognition of our rich history, June 6 has been designated Shriners International Awareness Day.














