



Burning Sands BOG Report - April 2023

Greetings from the 39 employees at Shriners Childrens Twin Cities Clinic, serving 7 states and 3 Canadian provinces. Why do families choose us? It's because pediatrics is our only focus. We provide 1) care and answers for unique diagnoses, 2) customized treatment plans, and 3) custom orthotics and prosthetics, to name a few.

Unlike my usual information for *Burning Sands*, I feel at this time I need to provide information on Twin Cities Clinic and Kem Temple. 2023 was the year of patient volume! In the Midwest market (Dayton, Chicago, St. Louis, Twin Cities), the goal is to have more screening clinics. We have slacked off on this. In 2018, the Twin Cities had 347 patient referrals from screening clinics, but only 3 patient screening clinic referrals in 2022!



It's time for the 894 KEM Shriners to get reorganized. Let's get some screening clinics scheduled. We can't expect our hospital representatives, Bruce, Chris, & Randy, to do this by themselves. Please reach out to them and offer your assistance. Wouldn't it be nice to contribute to the total patient Twin Cities referrals by scheduling 3 screening clinics in 2023. Devils Lake has already offered our first location for a screening clinic this year, so we now need to find potential patients for that screening. KEM currently has 312 TC Clinic patients. Let's try to increase that number to 325! Where else would you envision additional screenings?

Child Life (Twin Cities patient camp opportunity program) had a successful year in 2022. There were 264 participants in various camps and events. A sample of the activities included were fishing, water and snow skiing, kayaking, MN Viking camp, and a prom.

At a recent Uniformed Units meeting, the question was asked "Why can't we do camps/events in ND?" It can be done, but it would require serious planning. If you, as Shriners, are serious about providing a positive experience in ND for our kids that they would normally not have "close to home", it is time to step up! A good start would be setting up a joint steering committee with El Zagal ASAP to investigate the possibility. Just keep in mind the smiles YOU would get to see on the kids' faces when they can ski, fish, or go to a prom, etc. – many of them for the first time!

Additional Twin Cities updates:

We have hired a part-time surgeon to work out of Twin Cities 2 weeks a month until a permanent full-time surgeon is hired. The "Spirit of Halloween" (seasonal Halloween costume shop) donates once a year to the Twin Cities Clinic. This year they donated \$104,000 from their sales. This is the 12th year they have donated to Twin Cities.

We continue to have a working relationship with Blank Childrens Hospital in Des Moines and Boys Town in Omaha.

Outreach clinics have been reduced but hope to be on track when we hire a permanent surgeon. ND patients were able to be seen in Bismarck. The annual Gala fundraiser event will be held June 2 at the Depot in downtown Minneapolis. The goal this year is to raise \$300,000.

June 3 is the Spring Ceremonial. Please come out and support our new candidates, our Potentate Ted, and Lady Darlene.

In closing, together we can bring hope and healing to improve the lives of children, locally and around the world.



There was a discussion on the misconception of Divan meeting being secret. They are not. All members are welcome and encouraged to attend the meetings.


Every Noble should know what is going on in their Temple and know about upcoming events. Encourage the members in your unit to attend. The more involved they are, the

The last day was wrapped up by key note speaker Mark May, former NFL Super Bowl champion. My personal favorite of the conference was presented by Jordan and Tiffany Settles "Introducing

your family to the Shrine". They really brought home the message that in order for the Shrine membership to grow we need to make it a FAMILY FIRST atmosphere. They shared many ideas on how they have incorporated this at their Shrine center.

I had the privilege of attending the Oriental Guide Shrine Leadership Conference in Tampa, FL this past month. As a new Lady in the Shrine, I found it to be very enlightening and uplifting.

Day 1 began with an update on Shriner's Childrens by Dr Leslie Stewart. He shared the history of the hospitals and the evolution over the years. He also included maps with locations of the facilities and the types of facilities. He was a great speaker.

The afternoon breakout session was joint with the ladies and Nobles together. The moderators went over the Laws of Leadership which is based on the John C Maxwell book called 21 Irrefutable Laws of Leadership. We spent time going over several of these laws and diving in to reflect on our own personal leadership abilities. Big take aways from this session was to change the culture in the temples and be very up on strategic planning for the temple. Much of this was focused on bringing in new members with events that promote families. Day 2 the afternoons were spent having women's and men's workshops. 




