

Kem Temple
GRAND FORKS, NORTH DAKOTA

The name "Kem" was recommended by "Committee on Name" (I. A. Widlund, chairman) at the time the organization of a Shrine was being considered for Grand Forks.

It was suggested to the "Committee on Name" by the meaning of the ancient name of the Nile Valley (Egypt) as expressed in hieroglyphics, namely: black land and black soil. This designation appears upon the monuments and in the papyri of Egypt, variously interpreted from the hieroglyphical signs as "Kam," "Kem," or "Kamt," meaning as stated, black land or black soil, having, of course, special reference to the black alluvial soil of the Valley of the Nile, and in contradistinction to the reddish soil of the neighboring land on both sides of the Nile Valley.

The "alluvial soil" of the Red River Valley of the North, being so distinctly similar in color to the soil of the Nile Valley, the committee deemed it most appropriate and further agreed that this oriental name spelled "Kem" could not very easily be mispronounced, as is the case with many of the complicated names of other Shrines.



Twin Cities Shriners Childrens Board of Governors Report – June 2023

Greetings from your KEM representative to the Shriners Childrens Board of Governors.

First of all, thank you to Lynn and the Shrine Football Committee for another successful year. Although the games were shortened by lightning, hail, and tornado warnings, from the players' perspective it was still a successful week learning about Shriners and establishing lifelong friends. If you had any players from your area participate, please thank them for taking time to support the Shrine mission. Next year the Shrine week and games have been tentatively scheduled for June 18-22. This will be our 50th Anniversary of ND Shrine Football. Please mark your calendars!

This year marks the 100th Anniversary of orthopedic care at Shriners Childrens Twin Cities. On August 6, from 1-4 p.m., a celebration will take place at the Woodbury Clinic to commemorate this milestone. There will be music, activities, games, and Shrine unit displays, and lots of interaction with patients, employees, Shriners, and the public.

Summer Shrine Camps are in full swing in Minnesota. A Boundary Waters trip is new this year and is at full capacity. We were also told that Wisconsin and South Dakota camps are at capacity. Is there any headway with getting ND camps established? This would need to be a collaborative effort between EZ and KEM. Maybe a one-day event like ice fishing or summer pontoon rides and games held throughout ND could be a start. We can always build on this as we see fit. To get started, perhaps the Divan could initiate a KEM conversation on what type of event could be held and how to start the planning process.

As for the Midwest Market Project, we are working with our sister facilities in Chicago, Dayton, and St. Louis, continuing to find other healthcare systems to assist us in providing more care in more places. This is an ongoing effort.

We have been working diligently in finding a replacement surgeon for the one who transferred to Springfield. As of this report, I believe we have a part-time surgeon interested in the position. If hired this would complete our medical team.

We recently moved to a new electronic medical record system called EPIC. We had a few hiccups, but overall, the transition is going well. I would like to compliment the Twin Cities staff for helping with the transition in a timely manner so patient care was not interrupted.

Clinic visit numbers are slowly coming back to pre-covid levels. Keep looking for new patients, and hopefully we will have a screening clinic soon to identify additional new patients who can be referred to the Twin Cities.

Hope your summer is enjoyable so far! Thank you for allowing me to be your Board of Governors rep. Please contact me if you have any questions!



WHAT IS A PCM?

What's a PCM? Is a Permanent Contributing Member in the Shriners Hospital for Children, and it will continue working in behalf of unfortunate youngsters long after you've taken your final ride on the Black Camel.

The cost is \$150.00, completely tax-deductible, and will reduce your annual dues to \$45.00 by elimination the \$5.00 yearly hospital assessment. 
