Joey is the owner of Bjornson Construction where he specializes in renovations and woodworking.



2024 KEM Annual Meeting Report Roger Baier, Twin Cities Children's Board of Governors

Greetings from Shriners Children's Twin Cities.



2023 was, let's say, an interesting year. First, our administrator abruptly resigned in March to pursue another facility, so that left us scrambling to find a replacement. Chicago, ironically was setting up a Midwest Market Administrator position, and approached us about doing a joint position until we found a replacement. What we came up with in October was a clinic director position and promoted Melissa Forrest into that role. We then promoted Mindy Sewald to a clinic operations manager position to absorb some of Melissa's former duties. These two moves saved us about \$48,000 in salaries.

As you recall, in 2020 we became the first clinic model in the Shrine system, followed by Erie, Lexington, and Salt Lake City. Well, in 2023, the Shrine system once again called on us to be the first to convert from Cerner to Epic electronic medical records, which has been completed. 2030 will be the tentative completion date of all the other facility conversions to this software.

Last year I mentioned that we would be looking at accepting non-Shrine patients into our imaging and rehab services. I would to announce that we have fully implemented this change.

We also looked into improving transportation for patients in the metro area to get to clinic appointments. Medi-van companies and public transportation were being stretched to the limit, so we found a national company called "On the Go" which has filled the transportation void.

The Midwest Market Project is going well. This market consists of Twin Cities, Chicago, Dayton and St. Louis. We came together to share resources such as telehealth, physician credentialing, strategic planning, and group purchasing, to name a few. In 2023 we saved \$213,000 utilizing the Midwest Market. In 2024, we hope to expand into shared human resources and tele-psych services.

In May of 2023 we lost a valued surgeon to Greenville. We then needed to rely on contracted surgeons until we could find a replacement. I am proud to announce that Dr. Sinha was hired and started December 11. She specializes in pediatric orthopedic procedures, including spina bifida, as well as sports medicine. We are anticipating a \$300,000 savings by hiring vs. using contract coverage.

We were also able to secure a new medical director, who will begin in March 2024. Dr. Lang comes to us as a certified sports medicine surgeon. With these two hires we hope to have over 225 surgeries compared to 178 in 2023.

For 2024, we had a \$6 million budget approved, which is \$927,000 less than 2023. Majority of this savings came from Midwest Market and elimination of contract surgeons.

In 2024, we are hoping for 36 screening clinics, with each temple scheduling at least two. In 2023, we had 15 clinics completed in our catchment area.

In 2023, we were projecting 4,500 out-patient encounters at the clinic. Well, we smashed that number with 6,154 encounters for the year. This includes 510 new patients seen at the Twin Cities Clinic. The majority of these encounters were from clinic and rehab services. As for North Dakota, there were 193 patients seen at the Twin Cities Clinic. We hope in 2024 to at least match or exceed these numbers.

Donations for Twin Cities in 2023 surpassed \$4 million for the first time. The gala brought in \$520,000, which also was a record. In 2023, 1220 monthly gifts of \$100 or less were donated to the Twin Cities Clinic. Are you part of that monthly number, or are you an annual giver? Either way, thank you for your donation in helping us continue to provide quality care to our kids. We hope 2024 will be even better. Recent Parade of Glory events at Zor and Osman brought in \$465,000 and \$162,000 respectively. These were both records for their temples.

In summary, this year we celebrated our 100th anniversary of Shriners Children's Worldwide. Over the last century, Shriners Children's have given hope and healing to more than 1.5 million children all over the world. Our hospitals were the first to specifically treat children with burn injuries, and we offered the first program in the United States designed for children with spinal cord injuries. We continue to add new approaches and services, as specialized pediatric medicine evolves.

As we look toward our second 100 years, we know medical care and the way it is delivered will continue to change with the times. We also know that our patients and families will remain our first priority and that we will continue to do all we can to ensure our patients discover that they can chase their dreams and have amazing futures.
















Wheelchair Fund at Work
