

BOARD OF GOVERNORS REPRESENTATIVE SHRINERS CHIDREN' TWIN CITIES REPORT

As we continue with the Townhall meeting series, our most recent meeting was held in Deadwood SD.

Our Townhall sessions began with a tour of Strider Bikes Global HQ to see if this could be another rehab equipment option for us. We are all blown away on the product and what the potential could be in treating our kiddos. There will be more to come in the future on this piece of equipment.

At the Townhall meeting hosted by NAJA, Melissa Bongard, Clinic Director, presented a clinic update. Some of the items mentioned are as follows:

The Midwest Market consisting of Chicago, Dayton, St. Louis, and the Twin Cities continues to be going strong. an example of this is telehealth services as they continue to increase, particularly in the area of nutrition.

Another program becoming more popular is the helmet therapy program, which is used for babies with flatheads.

Our electronic medical record program called EPIC just had their one year anniversary. Overall, this is an improvement over our previous program that we used, and we are hoping to further expand in providing more statistical data to help us determine where we need to improve our patient care.

We are seeing more outside referrals from the community for our radiology services which is a program we started last year. Also discussed was continuing need for screening clinics. We are seeing an influx of patients in the cities coming from screening clinics this year and so we need to keep the momentum going.

Jennifer Sutch, donor development Director, has resigned with her last day being June 10. We wish her well on her future endeavors as she will be missed. She was instrumental in bringing in over \$30 million of donations over the past nine years that she was with our system.

Imperial sir Mark Hartz presented an update on Imperial happenings.

CAMP ACHIEVE DOWNHILL SKI DAY RECAP







On Sunday February 4th we had 100 patients and volunteers with immeasurable amounts of determination for Winter Camp Achieve downhill day at Afton Alps. Again this year we had families travel hours from Northern Minnesota, South Dakota, North Dakota, Iowa and Wisconsin, just for the opportunity to let their child visit the friends they have made at Shriners and to participate in an activity with other kids who have similar challenges. After a -20 degree ski day last year, the weather was perfect -- sunny and 40s! We had people for the first time ever coming in after a few runs to take off layers! Our dedicated volunteers arrived to the Meadow Den (a bigger room than last year -- YAY!) a bit earlier than the skiers for a brief orientation session. Once the kids arrived, the room was filled with excitement and noise — lots of noise! The kids were paired up with volunteers -- did I mention the noise? The adrenaline and excitement (pure CHAOS) in the room peaked as they headed off to get their skis, poles, and helmets, and then hit the slopes. When I say chaos, I mean all-out-crazy-have-no-idea-what-is-going-on-chaos-is-happening at the beginning of this event. After last year I promised Becky I would get her some help in the rental room because it is so hard fitting the ski boots on the kid's prosthetic legs. Becky B, Dr Sinha, her husband Jason and Carol H never stopped moving from the first kids who showed up at the rentals until the last. Boots on and off, trying to find the perfect fit. With Becky's guidance the new volunteers in the rental area were able to pull off a leg, shove a boot on the prosthetic foot, and help put the booted leg back on. Throughout the whole day, campers and their volunteers would take a break and come sit in chalet for a couple of minutes to rest up and have a snack and drop a layer of clothing. I love listening to them tell me exactly where they had been, what they had done, how many times they fell and how they just popped back up! Seeing the excitement in their eyes makes me so happy that I forget I am not able to be on the slopes and this is so much better -- because I would miss out if I was. We had a ton of first timers this year. One was Nellie, she had never been on skis and, according to her mother, is not very active in the winter and warned me she might not make it until lunch. I paired Nellie up with my daughter. Since they both have JRA, I figured they could talk about their joints hurting on the hill. I didn't see Megan and Nellie until lunch! They were having a blast. When they came in for lunch Nellie ran into her mom and said "I am having the best day ever." They were both back out on the hill over the lunch break and Nellie was one of the last kids to come off the hill. On one of their last trips down the hill, she said to Megan, "I have a great idea, you should take your mom's job when she retires you are really fun." Nellie's mom was in tears that her daughter tried something new and loved it. She sent a picture to Megan of Nellie sleeping before they even got out of the Afton ski resort.

Last year, we had Tim join us for the first time. He had never skied in his life and was super excited to join us. He came back up from Nebraska just to be around his new friends and to see if he could still ski. He not only could still ski, he was much stronger and more confident this year, so confident he felt comfortable just sitting down and giving his leg a breather. He says "being around the group at Shriners is the best thing that has happened to me after I lost my leg, this place has given me a new purpose and has helped with my confidence so much." Tim's mom has nothing but wonderful things to say about us and how we have helped her son not only with the medical and prosthetic leg but by introducing him to new friends and showing him that he can still live a full life. You can tell by watching her how proud she is of Tim and what he has accomplished.

This event would NOT happen without all the volunteers. We had 48 of them this year and needed every single one. Right away when the email went out for help, Dr. Sinha responded that she and her husband Jason would love to help. How awesome is that she had only been here a few months and is ready to be a part of the chaos! I put them right to work on helping with the fitting of equipment and about a hundred other chores. Once the kids were all on the hill they became part of the "Stand at the bottom of the hill gang" and took photos, cheered on the kids





Also new this year was the "CHALET ALL DAY SQUAD!" We had some teen girls who didn't want to ski but wanted to be a part of the day, so they came and volunteered in the chalet with me! How cool is that they want to be around their Shriners friends!

We welcomed Paralympian snowboarder Mark Mann again this year to help teach a couple of the kids some snowboard tricks. To have someone with that talent teaching was pretty incredible for our kids. A special shout out to Carole H, her husband Bob and their grandson Axel, Barb K, Meghan and Aaron. These former staff have been consistent volunteers for this event and their expertise and knowledge of what needs to happen for it to run smoothly helps my anxiety as much as anything else. We had a few new volunteers this year, thanks to Shriner Brad Ahrens who has a couple sons who are part of the Waconia Ski and Snowboarding Club, and he sent out a message that we could use help and we had a wonderful turn out with kids of all ages! These kids did an awesome job of jumping in and just doing what was needed without a lot of direction. John a new volunteer last year came back to help this year — even after last year's incident where I forgot to tell him the secret to keeping legs on is to set the patient leg on top of your ski. First time up in the chair lift they lost a leg. An Afton staff member grabbed it and brought it up to the top and off they went. Shout also goes to Shriners Bill V and Bob H who have helped recruit volunteers over the years, bring cookies, help pay the bills and are always there when you need them; they are exemplary Shriners and we are so fortunate they are part of the Twin Cities clinic.

The skiers came in for lunch, all excited about the progress they had made and the big hills they had conquered. They ate as fast as they could and off they went back to the hills for the afternoon. It was at lunch when I was presented a gift from the teen gals. I was presented a crown because in 2022 at the camping trip I earned the name "Queen Maureen." I can't imagine what I did to earn this title; surely not that I had the best tent location and a cot. I was instructed I needed to wear the beautiful tiara for the rest of the day. Who am I to say no to my loyal subjects! We had a hard time getting the kids off the hills in the afternoon. It was a great day filled with firsts, fist-pumps, friends, fun and FEZZY! It takes a "ski village" to get the kids out for a day of winter fun and accomplishment. In the end, we heard there were a lot of tired kids sleeping very well Sunday night!! This recap was extremely hard to write, it is filled with lots of emotions. 22 years ago I was lucky enough to be a part of the group that started these camps. I didn't realize back then how much meaning they would bring to those involved. We have

realize back then how much meaning they would bring to those involved. We have shared this journey with many incredible kids, parents, staff and volunteers. But the kids... they are simply rock stars. Amazing in so many ways. They provide smiles and hope and inspiration just by being themselves. These experiences have been the highlight of my career; the kids mean the world to me. I feel extremely fortunate and blessed to have been a small part of their Shriners journey. Thanks again to everyone for another successful day and for making such a huge impact on the lives of so many (yes... including mine!).

Report on the 2024 Annual Meeting of the Women's General Auxiliary for the Twin Cities Shriner's Clinic

I attended the 101st Annual Meeting of the WGA4Kids, also known as the Women's General Auxiliary as a representative for Kem Shrine. It was an informative event. We were able to tour the clinic, and everyone was extremely impressed with that facility. Although the Auxiliary space to store toys, blankets and all the other items that are given to the kids who come through the clinic is severely downsized from what they had at the hospital, the ladies have it very well organized and all the space is utilized as efficiently as possible.

We met a young lady, Ellie, who was fourteen years old, and she has been a patient at Shriner's since she was nine weeks old. She has a form of dwarfism that impacts her ligaments and tendons, so she is in a wheelchair. She has a motorized one that reclines and raises her up to counter height. The chair was provided by the Auxiliary and cost \$60,000. This is Ellie's fourth wheelchair that has been provided for her. She thanked the auxiliary for all that they do for her and said she is able to be as normal as possible with the help of the wheelchair. Her parents thanked us, too.

We heard from representatives of the temple auxiliaries attending regarding their fundraising events. I was happy to report that through the 49er's Shrine Club, Model T Unit, the Cycleers Unit, the Wonder Woman Walk, a memorial and others, Kem sent just under \$10,000 to the Auxiliary in 2023. Thank you to all of you who work to raise funds for this very worth-while organization. I am proud to be associated with Kem.

Here is a Snapshot of WGA's 100 Years (taken from their brochure)

The Beginning (1923-1948)



January 3rd and 4th, 1923 the General Auxiliary was organized with representatives from each temple in the district (Midwest).

With money raised, the following examples of items purchased by the Auxiliary: Sewing Machines, Chairs, Sheets, Piano, School Supplies, Traction Equipment, Electric Cast Cutter

Developing the Plan (1949-1973)

Purchased X-Ray Equipment Remodeled the nurses' station. Paid \$44,000 for Prosthetics Paid the salaries for three staff members totaling \$19,000 (These items took most of the funds raised for this period).

One Giant Leap of Faith (1974-1998)

Prosthetic purchases in 1976 totaled \$62,000.

Began fundraising for Parent Accommodation Center (PAC) building through Auxiliaries, Shriners, Friends and Estates totaling \$1,000,000. Hospital moved into new building in April, 1990 PAC Center opened April, 1991

A New Horizon (1999-Present)

Donated \$30,000 toward the purchase of the EOS machine. Advisory Board members liaison from auxiliaries to WGA Board Focus changed to wheelchairs and adaptive equipment, toys and blankets for the children. Moved into the new clinic and downsized from a building to a small room. Continued to revamp how we are to meet our goals of providing for the need of "Our Kids." Donated toward the Carver Machine for the making of prosthetics.



SHRINE CIRCUS 2024The 78th Annual Grand Forks Kem Shrine Circus was held April 26-28th. Over 20,000 people attended the seven shows at the Ralph **Engelstad Arena.
