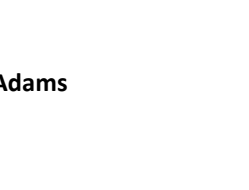

BOARD OF GOVERNORS REPRESENTATIVE SHRINERS CHILDREN' TWIN CITIES REPORT

It has been a relatively quiet summer, but an exciting one at Shriners Children's Twin Cities. Based on our patient survey results, they are at 97.3% likely to recommend Shriners Clinic.

We continue to show an increase in new patients seen in Twin Cities. Through July we had 402 new patients, compared to 284 in 2023, an increase of 118.

Telehealth continues to increase as we had 58 telehealth visits through July, exceeding our budget of 50 for the year.

Economic stewardship is at 47% to goal through June, which is above our projected target of 42%.

We continue to work with our affiliates in providing more care in more places. Currently our affiliations with Boys Town, Blank Hospital, Gilette Children's, and Children's Minnesota are moving along smoothly. We are now looking at adding new affiliations in SD, ND, and WI, which will expand our footprint.

Strider Bike, Rapid City, SD, visited the Twin Cities Clinic recently. A potential partnership with them is being reviewed as we both have the same vision, which is "everyone should have the opportunity to learn to ride a bike, no matter what their physical disabilities.

For 2025, we have submitted James Burma's name, El Riad Temple, to be our next Board Chairman. He would be replacing Darryl Finley, Tangiers Temple, who has been our chairman the last two years, whose term is up.

October 10 we will be having a Town Hall Meeting at El Zagal, Fargo. We will have speakers from Imperial and Twin Cities talk about current events occurring in the Shrine. We are expecting to see some representation from KEM at this Town Hall Meeting. More information will come as we get closer to the event.

In closing, enjoy the rest of your summer and early fall. Hope to see you at a Temple function!

The conference included many great speakers that discussed a variety of topics related to retaining existing members, recruiting new members, and included small group discussions where attendees could discuss issues each temple is facing and what is/is not working for them. Here are some of the highlights that were discussed.

- It is up to all nobles to work on membership. Each noble should have a goal to bring in at least one new Shriner a year. If you are an active member, bring a non-active member to your next meeting
- We need to be open to change and use the latest technology when possible. Remember, we are competing for members just like every other group in the world including the time our children's activities take.
- When talking with a prospective member, learn what is important (community involvement, having fun, family, helping others) to them first before you explain what it is to be a Shriner. Develop an elevator pitch, which may take practice, so you can speak confidently and intelligently to a prospective member about what it means to be a Shriner. This will create value in the eyes of the prospect.

Our temple is not alone when it comes to declining membership as there are very few Temples with growth the last few years. However, there are temples that are starting to turn the corner on growth membership, but it takes some time to create the culture and implement a positive experience. Let's start today on our journey to positive growth membership.

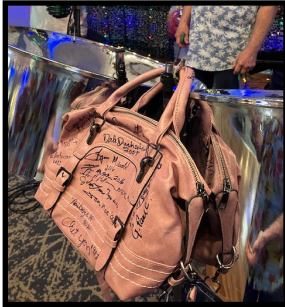

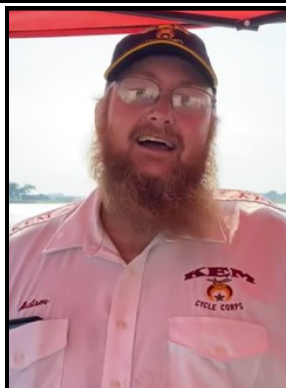

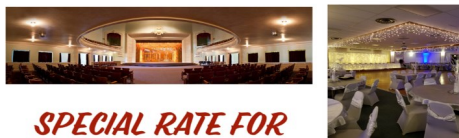
