325.11 Election Regulations.

- (a) Electioneering. A candidate for an elected office in a Shrine temple may print, publish and circulate during the year he is seeking the elected office, a résumé consisting of his educational background, his vocational history, and his Masonic and Shrine record. Except as provided in the prior sentence, the printing, publication, circulating or distribution of resolutions, letters, telegrams, tickets, email or other devices, by a unit, club, Noble, or group of Nobles, suggesting, recommending, opposing, or containing the names of proposed candidates for office in the temple is prohibited.
- **(b)** Expenditures Prohibited. The expenditure of money for gifts, favors, or entertainment on behalf of a candidate for elected office is prohibited.
- (c) Violation. For any violation of (a) or (b), the Imperial Potentate may suspend any offending Noble, and he may declare the election of the officer void and order a new election.
- (d) Notice. At least one week prior to the annual meeting or any election, the temple Recorder shall mail to each member a notice thereof containing this section.

BOARD OF GOVERNORS REPRESENTATIVE SHRINERS

October 2024

Greetings from Shriners Children's Twin Cities!

Twin Cities continues to see increases in clinic activities. New patient visits are at 557 through September compared to 411 in September, 2023. Telehealth visits are at 81, compared to 50 in 2023. Rehab visits are up 36%. Outreach clinic in Bismarck saw 17 patients last quarter; the highest it's been in a couple years. All of these are positives for the Twin Cities mission of "treating more kids in more places".

As for screening clinics, the last 2 in Minot and Devils Lake produced 5 referrals. We hope to find more patient referrals in the upcoming scheduled screening clinic, November 22, in Devils Lake. Contact Bruce Krabseth for more information. I assume in 2025 there will be more screening clinics scheduled in other KEM locations (Bottineau, Grand Forks, Crookston, & Bemidji). Reach out to hospital representatives, Bruce, Chris, or Randy if you can assist them in making these screening clinics a reality.

We continue to have affiliations with multiple facilities. Things are going well with Boys Town, Gilette Children's Hospital, and Minnesota Childrens. We are working with Blank Childrens in Des Moines, IA, to enhance patient care.

The long leg detector in radiology is being utilized. This was an \$88,000 piece of equipment that was in the budget for 2024 and was well worth the dollars spent on it.

Donor development is at \$2.3 million (66.6% of goal). We expect to reach our goal of \$3.5 million at the end of the year.

Kaufman Hall has been approved by the Joint Board to assist in implementing Vision 2035, and will be devising an enhanced strategic plan to achieve completion of Vision 2035 for the Midwest Market. (Chicago, St. Louis, Twin Cities, Dayton)

Lastly, El Zagal held a townhall meeting on October 10 and was well attended. 73 nobles from El Zagel, Yelduz, and Kem along with 15 board members and two Imperial Divan enjoyed a fine meal and heard updates from the Twin Cities staff and Imperial. Following the meeting, many of the attendees continued the conversations on topics from the presentation.



The beautiful flocked tree you see at the Shriner's Christmas party is donated by *ALL SEASONS GARDEN CENTER*. Here is the story:



At the age of 2, Jan Heitmann, was in a lawn mower accident that caused injury to her left leg. She was taken to St. Mike's Deaconess Hospital in Grand Forks. She was later visited by Nobles John Murrie (Langdon, ND), John McDonald (Walhalla, ND) and Jim McConnell (Grand Forks). They told her parents about Shriner's Hospital. At that time they had never heard of Shriner's, but had checked into other places for help. Mrs. Heitmann (Georgia) remembers clearly the sentence "We will take care of it all".

At that time they lived in Walhalla, ND so Jan was brought to Shriner's Hospital in Winnipeg, Manitoba to begin her long journey. At that time there were so many accidents that American Greeting Cards had a special card saying "sorry to hear about your accident." Jan still has the many cards she received from total strangers who read about her accident in the newspapers.

Jan continued to go to Winnipeg until the age of 12. Winnipeg Shriner's Hospital closed at that time due to the Canadian Health Care program. Jan continued her journey at the Twin Cities Shriner's Hospital, visiting at least twice a year to get fitted with a new prosthetic limb. At that time her parents were friends with an airman at the Nekoma Air Base. He witnessed that Jan's prosthetic limb could be more functional. He took it upon himself to research how to improve the prosthesis, designed one and sent the specs to Shriner's Hospital. That was life changing for many present and future patients. Mrs. Heitmann feels Jan possibly got the first hydraulic leg!

The Heitmann family was impressed by the kindness of the Shriner's Hospital staff and Nobles. Everyone felt like they were treated like a princess or a king. There would be groups of 50

patients that would be friends for a few hours or few days. Sometimes they would not see each other again, but it was important to have had that camaraderie.

The Heitmann's cannot say enough good things about Shriners. Every year the Heitmann's at All Seasons Garden Center have donated the beautiful flocked tree and plan to continue. Their kind words of "anything for the Shriners, just ask". This year we pay back in a little way too by purchasing gift cards to All Seasons Garden Center as door prizes.

Rumors Tavern in Finley, ND had their first KEM Shrine even in August. There was a full meal for \$10, jokes by JB, and live music by Blue English with all proceeds going to the Shriners Children's Twin Cities to provide help for Shriner patients. Rumors Tavern owner, Stephanie Stein, wants this to be an annual fundraiser.

Stephanie, Alexis in the middle, and Tina on the right.

Tina Mincer, a Finley, ND resident, is passionate about the Shriners and wants to give back what she can. At 9, she was breaking records as a swimmer and dreamed of competing in the Olympics. A friends mom noticed Tina had a slight limp and that was the start of extensive doctor's visits that would determine she would need a leg brace. Her dream of competing in swimming was crushed. A fundraiser for Tina was attended by family friends who were Shriners. After going through the proper procedures her journey with the Shriners began. She was diagnosed with Legg-Calve-Perthes disease and ended up with a Petrie Cast. It had two bars between her legs that held them four feet apart and weighed 25 pounds. Months of visits in and out of the hospital, hours of therapy to learn how to walk again, the struggles of fitting into cars or walking sideways down narrow hallways were part of her daily life. One day she was so determined to see her friend she walked an hour to get to her friend's house two blocks away. Thankfully she got a ride home but had to sit in the trunk of a car with one leg sticking out! Tina learned from her experiences that when you think you have it bad, look around. She witnessed a girl with polio who spent two years in the hospital and miraculously walked out of the hospital with crutches, a girl in the bed next to her had one leg and another had burns all over her body. The stories go on and on." I will always want to give back to the Shriners. My experience with them was so amazing, and it made me who I am today. They not only took care of my medical needs in the best way possible, they helped me become such an empathetic person and groomed me into who I am today. Because of my experience with the Shriners Hospital, I became a very caring, strong young girl and I was able to lead a normal, productive life. I live **life to the fullest."** She goes on to say that once you are involved with the Shriners as a patient, it is something you are always a part of.

WAS BROUGHT IN AT THIS FUNDRAISER!!



Former Shrine patient, Alexis, Finley, ND tells her story.

Alexis Nolan, who lived in Grand Forks around the time of the '97 flood, was two years old and begged to help mom stir the spaghetti sauce on the stove. Accidents happen so fast it could not have been stopped resulting in both Alexis and her brother being burned by the hot spaghetti sauce. Alexis was rushed to the Fargo hospital and later jetted to Minneapolis with 28% of her body burned. Her brother was burned on and behind one ear and cheek. A year and a half into her care, and funds running out, a Shriner approached her mom at the grocery store offering help with Alexis' care. He told her all they had to do was get on a plane and go to Shriners Burn Center in Cincinnati, Ohio. No more worrying about medical bills, flight costs, or food while there. Alexis' family could focus on her while going through all the years of painful skin grafts and other related surgeries. She was at Cincinnati until she was 14 when they switched to Shriners Burn Center in Galveston, Texas. Grateful for the entire Shriners team at both hospitals who gave excellent care for both Alexis' care but also for "mom" if she was having a meltdown. Alexis had many follow-up appointments and surgeries until the age of 20. She grew up with the Shriners.

"They taught me compassion, understanding, humility, kindness and so much more than I can put in words. They made me see the world and its people from a point of view that most people never get the chance to see. I am grateful to everyone who showed me the kindness and compassion when they didn't have to. It means more to me than anyone will ever know. I am grateful beyond measure because you are the reason I am alive."



Shrine patient, Micah Jensen, and his dad came from Iowa to speak at Kem's Tables du Jour on Oct 26.

Micah was born with spina bifida and was paralyzed below his ankles. As a younger child Micah stayed to himself afraid of others judging him because of his disability. Twenty-eight surgeries later, his is no longer that loner but very social. He doesn't let anything stop him. In fact he played baseball, with accommodations, and did great.

Micah graduates in 2025 and plans on going on to schooling in the medical field.

Micah and Patrick went to the UND Hockey game with us and watched the excitement of a good game. Micah was impressed with the "Ralph".




