BOARD OF GOVERNORS REPRESENTATIVE SHRINERS CHILDREN'S TWIN CITIES REPORT

Greetings, Nobles!

The first quarter of 2025 has been a quarter of adjustment as we began to work with a new strategic plan, payroll system, and a revamped Twin Cities Marketing Plan. More to come on this.

Other news to bring to your attention are as follows:

The Clinic interior recently received a new coat of paint and a new audiovisual system.

- · Currently we have no open employee positions. "YAY"
- · We continue to develop a sports medicine program in the Twin Cities

Metro and have hired an athletic trainer to promote this program to area schools.

- The Twin Cities Genomic studies now has 15 families enrolled since its inception in November 2024. This is more than some other Shrine sites who have been doing these studies the last four years.
- · Boys Town has added an enhanced GAIT program called "Power Lab", which now includes brain imaging with neurological focus.
- · Bismarck Bone & Joint Clinic was disappointed that they needed to terminate our contract with them as they expand into other parts of the building. We are currently looking for another Bismarck location for our June clinic.
- · We are continuing talks with Astera Health, Sanford, and Hudson Wisconsin Physician Group for potential affiliation/collaboration.

Statistics remain flat through February but are seeing an increase in telehealth services and rehab.

- · Survey results indicate the "Likelihood to recommend the clinic to others" continues to be above average 85%.
- Through February out-patient volumes are below budget by 120; rehab services are above-budget by 197; telehealth services are above budget by 11; new patients are below budget by 15. There are numerous screening clinics scheduled in our 7, states which should help bring our numbers up. Let your "fingers do the walking" and reach out to Bruce, Randy, or Chris to see what you can do to assist with upcoming KEM screening clinics.
- Donations through February are at 17% of target. Donations for the Temples are averaging \$3,076. Club donations are averaging \$1,966.
- · Upcoming events
- **WGA4Kids, annual meeting April 28, at Lake Elmo Holiday Inn.
- **The Shriners Children's Gala is scheduled for October 25, at Radison Blu Mall of America. More details will soon be available.

Some additional information: *Genomics study now at 30 families which is phenomenal.

- *Upcoming miracle baseball league on modified field suited for limb differences, etc is at 160 participants.
- *Planning up to 5 theater events for patients and families.
- *Twin cities has patient videos for use at temple meetings, speaking events, etc. Contact Lauren Elm if you want to use any. Also available is radio PSA.
- *All employees are vaccinated for measles, which is good to hear.

Natalie Sims: Paralympic Swimmer



Para swimming for men and women has been a part of the Paralympic program since the first Games in 1960 in Rome, Italy. Today, the races are highly competitive and among the largest and most popular events in the Paralympic Games. Paralympic swimming competitions occur in 50-meter pools and, while competing, no prostheses or assistive devices may be worn.

Paralympic swimming competition is open to male and female athletes with physical disabilities such as dwarfism, amputation/limb loss, blindness/visual impairment, spinal cord injury/wheelchair-users, cerebral palsy/brain injury/stroke, cognitive impairment, and Les

Former Shriners Children's Twin Cities patient Natalie Sims was late to the game when it came to competitive swimming, but her desire elevated her to the next level.

After starting in the eighth grade, much later than her competitors, Sims rose through the ranks and made her third-consecutive United States Paralympic swimming team, competing at the 2024 Paralympic Games in Paris.

Sims was born without her right hand, and her father, Mike Sims, said the family took their daughter to Shriners Children's Twin Cities when she was just 6 months old, staying with the nonprofit healthcare system until she graduated from care when she was 18. Mike said that since his daughter had no right hand but still had her wrist, compared to some who are also born without a forearm, she was very functional without prosthetics.

"Although she didn't use prosthetics much, she really benefited at Shriners Children's by seeing other kids with limb deficiencies," Mike said. "She went to Camp Achieve, which was a week during the summer, and Shriners Children's patients from all over the region were there. There were kids with all sorts of conditions and different limb deficiencies. It was important for Natalie to see other kids that looked like her, being active and seeing just how much they could do. She looked forward to Camp Achieve every single year, and she's even gone back to volunteer as an adult."

Natalie Sims said Shriners Children's and Camp Achieve helped boost her confidence and encouraged her to follow her dreams.

"Don't let your disability define who you are," said Natalie. "If you want to chase your dream, there is nothing standing in the way but yourself. It's going to be hard, grueling work, but the reward is knowing you gave it your all. Just because you have a disability, that shouldn't limit what you love to do."

Mike Sims said Shriners Children's provided his daughter with whatever she needed to compete in any sport she wanted. Natalie didn't take to team sports as much but loved individual competition. Shriners Children's helped her with prosthetics for tennis, riding bikes and more. The individual sport she truly fell in love with was swimming. She went on to swim collegiately at the University of Wisconsin-La Crosse, and she qualified for her first Paralympics just after graduating high school in 2016. While the 27-year-old swimmer has had plenty of success, she hadn't hit the podium at the Paralympics until Paris 2024, when she earned a bronze medal as a member of the mixed 4x100-meter freestyle relay.

"A strong performance in Tokyo ignited her desire to compete in Paris and reach the medal podium," Mike Sims said. "The whole Paralympic journey has been life-changing for her. In the process, she's gained so much confidence. As a three-time Paralympian, she's the role model and the leader. Now there's a new crop of younger swimmers, and it's fun to see it go full circle."

Items that are not sold are donated to charitable thrift shops.

Kem Shrine Gun Raffle

In the fall, Kem Kamperz hosts a table where homemade donuts are sold, and participants can interact with a Plinko board for the chance to win a 50/50 drawing.





- · Masons and Shriners working together for a more stable membership.

- · The Divan does not have to do all the work.
- · Nobles work with all Nobles for involvement within the Shrine.
- · Update Nobles through the Divan.

When you are a Noble of the Temple you should talk to others with respect so the Noble is willing help you when you need the help.

Leadership will be successful when you include all Nobles in the decisions.

Point in hand: When we raise money for the temple make sure all tickets/posters say "Kem Shrine" not "Shriners Hospital for Children"/ "Shriners Children's". It is the Nobles responsibility to not put anything on the poster that has the "Shriners Children's Hospital" logo, or the hospital will receive the money and not your temple or unit. The Charitable Fundraising benefits the Shriners Children's Hospital. Fraternal fundraising supports the temple or unit.
