Board of Governors May 2025 Report

Greetings, Nobles!

The first four months of 2025 have been interesting as we continue to work with the new strategic plan and with potential affiliations. More to come on this...

Other news items to bring to your attention are as follows:

We have been referring spine patients to Chicago since the retirement of Dr. Polly. Through April there have been six referrals.

We continue to coordinate plans with Chicago providers for a Cleft Lip and Palate Clinic to be held in the Twin Cities in July. This will also provide the opportunity to begin speech therapy services to bring in additional patients to our Rehab Department.

We have had 46 shared cases across the Midwest Market (Twin Cities, Chicago, Dayton, St.

Louis). With our reappointment of providers to continue practicing at the Clinic, we can now reintroduce Sports Medicine Clinics in collaboration with our Limb Clinics.

The genomics project is up to 48 subjects enrolled. With that, we are starting to work on proposals for two retrospective research studies. Our goal is to have 55 subjects by the end of June.

Our online educational programs for school nurses, social workers, etc. (Monthly Mugs) continues to be well-attended as we had over 260 registered for the May sessions. If you know of any school nurses, etc. looking for online education sessions, please contact the Twin Cities regarding this program!

Human Resources has announced that merit increases were implemented in May. Carmen Morales was voted "employee of the quarter". Due to a resignation, we have an open position for a Philanthropy Director. We are currently interviewing 6 applicants.

Finance - a few statistics of interest (through April): Surgery is up 30% from last year

Net patient revenue is up 66% from last year

Rehab visits are at 928 vs. 520 budgeted

Telehealth visits are at 40 vs 16 budgeted

New patient visits are at 225 compared to 224 budgeted

Philanthropy - notes of interest: Nobles donating year-to-date is at 229, with an average gift of \$104

We had 17 Temples donate, with an average of \$2,660 YTD

The overall goal for planned and major gifts was raised to \$3.65 million for 2025
















Order of Eastern Star, Rainbow Girls and DeMolay sell novelties at the Shrine Circus.

Meet new Shriner, Brayden Drevlow.

Brayden has worn many hats for his young years, the latest being his grandfather, James Goldsberry's, FEZ. Brayden became a Shriner at the 2025 Shrine Circus. He was fezzed by his dad, Kem Shrine Noble Joe Drevlow, with is Grandma Goldsberry by his side. Brayden is a concert pianist and adventure traveler from Thief River Falls, Mn. He has won several concerto competitions and has performed as a featured soloist with multiple symphony orchestras along with extensive solo piano tours in the US. He was praised by a President as "wonderful and dynamic". Brayden's passion when he travels is to tune piano's, and of course, give them a taste of his music. The look on the children's faces when they hear what the music is supposed to sound like makes him want to reach out to as many people and countries as he can.



Brayden has traveled to over 100 countries, including every corner and almost every National Park in the US. He speaks English, German, Russian, Icelandic, and Thai. He doesn't pick the popular, safe places to visit, instead he picks places like the Congo and Siberia. He was in China when Covid-19 began, Afghanistan when the Taliban took over (and accused him of being a spy), Sudan during the coups, and Turkey postearthquake.

If you ever get a chance to sit with this young man, you will be entertained by his stories and in awe of how he shares himself and his talents around the world.

Here, in his own words, is the story he told me about Siberia:

"The journey started in Moscow. It takes about twelve hours to fly across Russia. The weirdest thing was starting out on a Tuesday at 2:30 and landing at 2:30 on the same Tuesday because so many time zones were crossed. I then had to find a guy to drive me 4000 miles east into Siberia. The highways stopped so we had 4000 miles of frozen forest dirt roads and crossing frozen rivers. These roads were made by political prisoners from Gulag during Stalin's reign. Stalin had insisted on having a road that went across Russia. It was so cold in this area that about 3 million people died building this road. The bones of these people were crushed and put into the mead of the road. We had three flat tires along the way because bones were sticking up out of the road puncturing the tires. This trip got me to Yakutsk when it was -50*F. We eventually go to the

village of Oymyakon, 571 miles down the "road", where the temperature was -76*F. They only close schools when the temperatures get below -55*F. This settlement has about 500 people that are caribou herders. At this temperature one can get frostbite in 90 seconds. These temperatures result in many of the people are missing the tips of their noses, have no earlobes and the cheeks are pitted from the frost bite. The people there

have evolved to be shorter and have stubby fingers. They heat their homes with wood. This area has trees like Minnesota. In the summer it is 90*F with lots of mosquitos, because all that snow melts creating bogs. Continued on next page.





Continued story from Brayden Drevlow's own words

One of the main staples in this Siberian village is the intestines of horses that have been butchered. They throw it outside for five seconds until it freezes like a rod, then slice it into rings to eat. The purpose of eating this is that it is so bad for you that it makes one get a stomach ache, which in turn causes the body to make extra body heat. They literally plan to get sick to make extra body heat. Since I was there and there was no Lays Potato Chips, I was forced to eat it as well. It tastes very rubbery.

It is an interesting realization that at -75* it is colder than the planet Mars, so people are dressed like a spaceman everywhere you go. I was instructed on the first day I was there that since they cannot have indoor plumbing because the pipes would freeze, you go to the outhouse. There you need to take off your glove to hold on to your appendage so it doesn't get frostbite. You cannot sit down so you need to sit on your hands while squatting and every minute or so you need to take off your gloves and rub your butt cheeks to avoid getting frostbite. Like in Minnesota/North Dakota when we take boiling hot water and throw it in the air and it freezes, it is the same when going to the outhouse in Siberia. I watched my #1 turn to snow and fall to the ground and the #2 immediately vaporizes and particles fly around your face. Icicles are in the outhouse, so you see them hanging and you are slipping around on them. One day I was walking along with some friends, decided to relieve myself by a fence. I thought it was rude that the friends I was with walked away and left me alone in the cold. I asked them why they did that. They responded "there was a wolf on the other side of the fence looking at you". One of my favorite memories was as a good American, I thought I should teach the kids baseball. We did not have a bat and ball, so we used a frozen tomato and a frozen fish.

I wanted to go there to play a concert for these kids because they hardly ever get visits from any foreigner. In the city logbook I was the first foreigner in 3 years. I played Scott Joplin as they would probably have never heard it or hear it again. Even on the edge of the world I saw them dancing their feet to the good American music. " I DON'T KNOW ABOUT YOU, BUT I FIND THIS YOUNG MAN TO HAVE A BIG PERSONALITY AND IS SUCH A GOOD HUMAN. I HAVE WATCHED





to slip up and misplace my purse so it can go on a adventure without me. I'm sure someday it will happen and there will be photos to prove it.





VETERANS HONOR FLIGHT


Veterans Honor Flight of ND/MN Grand Forks, ND April 20-22, 2025

The Veterans Honor Flight left Grand Forks International Airport, Easter Sunday April 20th. We had two planes depart GF; Bravo flight at 7:30 am and Alpha flight at 8:30 am.

Driving into the GF airport it was astonishingly powerful. There were at least a dozen Law Enforcement (GFPD & GF County Sherrif off duty) vehicles with all their light flashing. At 6:00 am, these lights could be seen for miles. The officers were out of their vehicles in uniform, recognizing every vehicle that drove past them. Sunday, as soon as we landed, we were off to tour Ft. McHenry. After a special time at the Ft. McHenry memorial, we were off to WWII Memorial. Both were fantastic. Especially Ft. McHenry with thoughts of how it was built with primitive tools. Closing the long day at 7 pm with a great banquet with entertainment and especially visiting with the veterans.



Monday, We all started early at 6:45 am with breakfast, then on to the busses to; National Archives, Navy Memorial, US Marine Corps Memorial, Arlington National Cemetery, Changing of the Guard ceremony, Woman Veteran Memorial & Air Force Memorial. We returned to the hotel at 6:15 pm for social hour/dinner with "Mail Call".

Tuesday, At 6:45 am we enjoyed a plated breakfast, then on the busses to; FDR Memorial, Korean, Lincoln & Vietnam Memorials, National Museum of the US Army. Flew out at 5 pm arriving Grand Forks at 8 pm.

The most touching event was when each veteran received their envelope for "Mail Call". I was able to present some mail envelopes; they were excited and over whelmed with the whole aspect of getting mail. As I watched around the room, there were so many reading their letters from family members and friends, there were many tears running down the faces of these incredible strong veterans. It was hard to hold myself together watching the emotions each of these veterans were feeling with the thought that while they were serving our country, they didn't receive much or any mail. On our flight home, I was sitting close to a gentleman that opened his envelope and read and reread his mail, and each time wiping tears.






